

Paper Development “Hackathon”

October 5-6, 2019



Thirty-six hours in October—a unique opportunity for management scholars to develop their work for possible publication in *AMD*. During the “hackathon”, participants will meet with *AMD* Associate Editors and Editorial Review Board members — several times over the weekend — to discuss, revise, and improve successive versions of their empirically-driven working papers.

Preference for acceptance will be given to working drafts and complete papers, but data-supported concept frameworks will also be considered. In line with the [mission of AMD](#), all submissions should be framed around empirical exploration.

AMD editor, [Peter Bamberger](#), will choose the papers that will be invited to the “hackathon.”

Final selections will reflect

1. The areas of expertise of *AMD* AEs and ERB members participating in the “hackathon” and
2. The likelihood that a paper can be revised in a way that will make it publishable in *AMD*.

Papers that are already under review at *AMD* (or elsewhere) cannot be submitted to the “hackathon.”

Papers that are accepted to and developed through the “hackathon” does not guarantee acceptance and publication in *AMD*. These papers will need to go through the same peer review process as any *AMD* submission. However, it is our hope that the “hackathon” experience provides attendees with substantive feedback to improve their work.
